STOP the Grand Jury!

EVE ROSAHN is one of eight grand jury resisters jailed at the Metropolitan Correctional Center for 9½ months for refusing to collaborate with the RICO grand jury attack on the Black Liberation Army. This grand jury is empanelled under the Racketeering, Influence and Corrupt Organizations (RICO) Act, a law which gives the state power to indict people solely on their political associations. Eve Rosahn has a 12-year history of support and solidarity for the Black Liberation Army and the New Afrikan Independence Movement. She is part of the growing anti-imperialist movement which supports the right of oppressed nations to wage armed struggle for their liberation. She has consistently taken a principled stand of non-collaboration with any form of the FBI's COINTELPRO attacks on the New Afrikan Independence Movement and will never collaborate with the grand jury. Eve Rosahn is a plaintiff in Clark v. U.S.A., a civil lawsuit based on the F.B.I.'s illegal break-ins ("black bag jobs"), phone tapping, and bugging of anti-imperialist activists.

Non-collaboration is a fundamental principle of revolutionary struggle which identifies the state (and its legal apparatus) as the enemy. When public, anti-imperialist activists, like Eve Rosahn, take a stand of non-collaboration, they build the mass resistance to the government's attack on one of the leading revolutionary forces, the armed clandestine movement of the New Afrikan Independence Movement. Non-collaboration is a revolutionary strategy which is the only way to stop the grand jury because it is part of the struggle to defeat u.s. imperialism.

On October 26, 1982, Eve Rosahn will appear in court, pro se, to argue her "Grumbles" motion. She will argue for her immediate release based on the fact that her incarceration is punitive and illegal. The government has always known that she would never collaborate and that jailing her would never "coerce" her into testifying.

Come to court to show your support for Eve Rosahn and all grand jury resisters. Demonstrate outside the courthouse and participate in building a mass movement of resistance, based on the revolutionary principle of non-collaboration.
