**ARE THE BLACK PANTHERS VIOLENT?** Panel discussion between the Black Panthers and the Peace and Freedom Party. Participants are Bobby Seale, Bob Avakian, and Mike Parker. Elsa Knight Thompson is the moderator. Recorded 2/15/68

Newton about his reaction to his conviction of voluntary manslaughter and to the police shoot-up of the Black Panther headquarters on August 10th. Also in the program you will hear a description of the scene at the shot-up Black Panther Headquarters, and interviews with Black Panther Chairman Bobby Seale, Black Panther Minister of Information and Peace and Freedom Candidate for the Presidency Eldridge Cleaver, Defense Attorney Charles Garry and a non-Panther witness to the police shoot-up.
