

# BUILD A REVOLUTIONARY RESISTANCE MOVEMENT AGAINST U.S. IMPERIALISM!

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## Who We Are

We are 2 revolutionary anti-imperialist communist resistance fighters. We are revolutionaries and we are part of the developing armed clandestine movement in the Northamerican oppressor nation. We have worked as public activists and organizers in the anti-imperialist movement in building political support and material aid for the national liberation movements in Zimbabwe and Palestine fighting to rid their nations of imperialist domination and for self-determination. We have organized against the KKK and zionism, against killer cops and white supremacist vigilantism and in solidarity with the New Afrikan/Black national liberation and Puerto Rican Independence movements.

Several years ago, each of us decided to go underground to help establish and build armed clandestine organization in the Northamerican oppressor nation as an important part of developing a strategy for a revolutionary anti-imperialist resistance movement. From our past work we had learned from the national liberation movements that the path to national liberation and the defeat of imperialism lies in armed resistance and revolution. We believed we needed to apply these lessons to our own movement and looked particularly to the examples of the BLA and FALN. As communists, we have begun to build revolutionary organization that can fight against the common enemy and lead many forms of resistance against U.S. imperialism.

The last few years has seen the rise of the revolutionary masses and growing national liberation war from Central America to Azania/South Africa to the Phillipines. In response, the Northamerican armed clandestine organizations, the United Freedom Front, Armed Resistance Unit, Red Guerilla Resistance and the Revolutionary Fighting Group, have carried out a campaign of armed solidarity.

When the U.S. invaded Grenada, the Northamerican armed clandestine movement attacked the U.S. capitol, when the Zionist entity "Israel" massacred Palestinian refugees at Sabra and Shatila, the Puerto Rican FALN and the Northamerican armed clandestine movement retaliated and attacked zionist forces here; when the U.S. war machine mobilized its forces to "practice" an invasion in Central America, the armed clandestine movement destroyed the naval officers' club at U.S. naval command headquarters in Washington, D.C. and attacked U.S. recruiting stations. When the Azanian people rose up in rebellion against the racist South African regime, the Northamerican armed clandestine movement attacked U.S. corporate interests here and the South African consulate in New York. These armed attacks, in retaliation against imperialism and in solidarity with the national liberation movements mark a qualitative advance in our movement's commitment to fight with arms to defeat U.S. imperialism. As communists, we fight for the right of self-determination and national liberation, to defeat white supremacy and zionism, to defeat male supremacy and fight for the liberation of women. We fight for socialism and the final defeat of U.S. imperialism.

## Our Current Situation

On November 29, 1984, we were captured in Cherry Hill, N.J. We are charged with transporting explosives and weapons and false identification. We are charged with conspiring to possess materials to be used against the U.S. government. We say the U.S. government represents the system that is the most terroristic and criminal, violent and dangerous the world has seen - comparable only to the German nazi regime. We say it can be resisted and this is the right and responsibility of all progressive people. Since our capture, we have been held under maximum security conditions at the Metropolitan Cor-

rectional Center in New York City. We are currently being held in preventive detention with no bail because the U.S. government has concluded that we are "a danger to the community". We are the first people to be held in New Jersey under the new bail law of 1984. We have been classified as "terrorists/extremists" and subjected to on-going political harassment along with other captured freedom fighters and political prisoners.

On March 4, we will go on trial in Federal Court in Newark, New Jersey. The judge, Frederick Lacey, has said he will not allow us to conduct a political trial, he will do everything possible to maintain the U.S. government lie that we are criminals. The U.S. imperialist state will not recognize that there are Prisoners of War, political prisoners or freedom fighters in U.S. prisons - because to do so means the acknowledgment that, 1. there is an undeclared war against the internal colonies and Puerto Rico, and 2. there is organized resistance, both from the national liberation movements and the beginning of armed solidarity from the oppressor nation. The government's strategy against us is to get a quick conviction, sentence us to long prison terms, tightly control all information about us so that our politics and actions can be misrepresented and later, inside the prisons, isolate us and attempt to destroy our political identities. This is called criminalization. Judge Lacey was handpicked to try our case. He is a Reagan appointee to the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court. This is a court that sits in secret in Washington, D.C. to determine CIA requests for international electronic surveillance monitoring against "subversive elements". Lacey was the attorney for the Newark Police Dept. throughout the 1960's. He has an active and long history in suppression and repression.

#### Fighting Repression/Building Revolutionary Resistance

We believe it is the responsibility of Northamericans to resist and fight imperialism at every level. We are a part of this developing resistance - from the 1000's of people who have pledged to engage in acts of protest on the event of a U.S. invasion of Central America, to the daily protests against racist South Africa to the developing resistance in Third World communities against racist attacks. We ask all progressive people to support us and all the Prisoners of War, political prisoners, resistance fighters and grand jury resisters. We ask you to support our case, as a legitimate and important aspect of building resistance to U.S. imperialism. We ask you to learn about and support the anti-imperialist comrades who were captured in Cleveland in November, 1984, Ray Levasseur, Richard Williams, Jaan Carl Laaman, Pat Gross, Barbara Curzi. It is especially important now to support the recently captured Black comrades, the New York 8 against fascist terrorism. The attack on them is a direct attack by the U.S. imperialist state in its attempt to destroy the revolutionary New Afrikan/Black National Liberation struggle.

With each day our hatred of the enemy fuels our determination to resist and continue the struggle.
